The community is coming together to help West Michigan families avoid homelessness. On June 20, Community Automotive Repair will donate proceeds of oil changes and car washes to ICCF's Family Haven, a program providing temporary apartments to homeless families.

Family Haven residents work with staff to resolve the issues that led to homelessness and to secure permanent housing. In this economy, a family may have owned their home for 20 years, lost their job and gone into foreclosure. "It's a needed ministry in times when families are scraping to get by," says Family Haven Director Deb Armstrong. "We help people go through rough days and give them hope. Homeless people live off hope every day."
